RE: Recommended Motor Vehicle Pricing Schedule for the Grand List of 2009

This memo is in reference to section 12-71d of the Connecticut General Statutes and the Office of Policy and Management's recommended pricing schedule for motor vehicles on the 2009 Grand List. We have discovered that the NADA Used Car and Older Used Car Guides no longer reference average retail price. Since both Guides have been recommended some confusion may arise as to which of the listed values should be used to reflect average retail price. NADA officials have affirmed that "the average retail price referenced in the Connecticut General Statutes is actually their Clean Retail value." Consequently, since the terms average retail and clean retail are equivalent, the clean retail value as published in the Guides is recommended for use in the preparation of the 2009 Grand List. As always, the valuation of motor vehicles not included in the recommended schedules continues to be the responsibility of the assessor
